

Congregational and Worship Services	 From 14 June Up to 50 persons, without pre-event testing, Up to 250 persons, in zones holding no more than 50 persons each, with pre-event testing for all worshippers 		
Live performance elements during congregational and other worship services	 Up to 30 persons allowed Unmasking for singing, playing of wind/brass instruments and speaking is not allowed Use of face shields in lieu of masks is not permitted 	 From 21 June Up to 30 persons allowed 10 allowed to unmask, of which 2 can be unmasked for singing or playing of wind/brass instruments 	 From Mid-July (date to be announced later) Up to 30 persons allowed 10 allowed to unmask, of which 5 can be unmasked for singing or playing of wind/brass instruments
Other Religious Activities (e.g. religious rites, classes)	 Religious rites allowed subject to prevailing group size of 5 persons All other religious activities (e.g. religious classes) are not allowed. 	 From 21 June Religious rites and all other religious activities (e.g. religious classes) are allowed not exceeding 50 persons per activity and subject to a total premise cap of 150 	
Marriage Solemnisations	 From 14 June Up to 50 attendees without pre-event testing, Up to 250 attendees, with pre-event testing for all attendees 		
Wakes, Funerals and Post-Funeral Rites	 From 14 June Up to 20 persons at any one time 		
Recording and Broadcasting Services	 Up to 15 persons allowed. Out of which 10 persons can un-mask, with no more than 2 un-masked for singing and/or playing of wind/brass instruments ROs must notify CPRO in advance 	 Up to 30 persons allowed. Out of which 10 persons can un-mask, with no more than 2 un-masked for singing and/or playing of wind/brass instruments ROs no need to notify CPRO in advance 	 From Mid-July (date to be announced later) Up to 30 persons allowed. Out of which 10 persons can un-mask, with no more than 5 un-masked for singing and/or playing of wind/brass instruments ROs no need to notify CPRO in advance

REQUIREMENTS FOR PRE-EVENT TESTING (PET)



	Pre-event testing	Details
•	What type of test is acceptable?	MOH-approved COVID-19 test (either an Antigen Rapid Test (ART) or Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) test) administered by an approved test provider. # Self Test Kit results are not acceptable.
•	How much does it cost?	ART : Avg \$50 PCR : Ranges from \$150 - \$250. # no funding provided for tests
•	Where can I book the test?	List of approved PCR and ART test providers are at https://www.moh.gov.sg/licensing-and-regulation/regulations-guidelines-and-circulars/details/list-of-covid-19-swab-providers .
•	Are there exemptions to taking PET?	i. Individuals vaccinated in Singaporeii. Individuals with an exemption notice# Valid documentation must be shown
	How long is my test result valid for?	The test results are only valid for 24 hours from the time an individual registers at the testing premises to take the test. The RO must ensure that the result of the test is valid until the end of the worshipper's participation in the worship service.

PRPP ART Result Slip

This will be issued by clinics in printed, hard-copy form.

Ensure the result is Negative and within the required validity period.



PET Status Check Function on SafeEntry (Business) app

This will appear on your screen if the attendee/patron has been checked-in and does not require PET.

If 'Entry Restricted' appears, Event Organisers/Relevant Enterprises must verify against the Acceptable Documents and the validity period before allowing entry.
